The journal is being published since 2012. It aims to publish original, theoretical and practical advances in Computing, Intelligence Technologies, Communication Technologies, Computer Science, Information Technology and all interdisciplinary streams of Engineering Sciences. It intends to disseminate original, scientific, theoretical or applied research in the field of Computing, Intelligence Technology and Communication Technology and allied fields. It provides a platform for publishing results and research with a strong empirical component. It aims to bridge the significant gap between research and practice by promoting the publication of original, novel, industry-relevant research. IJCICT follows a single-blind peer review system and carry out two rounds of review process.

3. IJCICT support green open access and accepted manuscripts can be self -archived following our Article Sharing Policy and are required to attach a CC-BY-NC-ND license (<https://creativecommons.org/licenses/>).
